FRIDAY, MARCH 1, 6PM FIRST FRIDAY ASTRONOMY NIGHT

An evening of fun for the whole family! Join us for just part, or all of our monthly astronomy nights! Doors open at 6pm for a <u>Mission2Mars</u> activity for elementary school students.
